

## Summary

### I . Statistics Table on Enterprises (Those with manufacturing establishments with four or more employees)

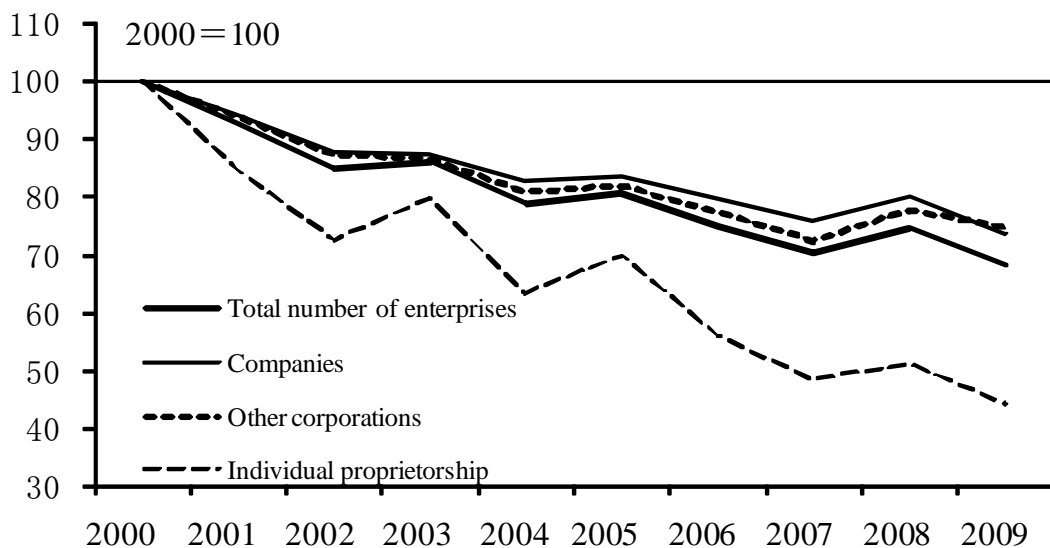
The Statistics Table on Enterprises indicates the activity status of manufacturing establishments with four or more employees by the tabulation that was converted from the establishment-based to the enterprise-based.

The number of manufacturing establishments with four or more employees in 2009 was 235,817 (down by 10.4% compared to the previous year). The number of enterprises converted from the establishment-based data was 212,457 (down by 10.7% id.). (Figure 1, Table 1 and Table 2)

#### 1. Number of enterprises

- (1) According to the tabulation of the enterprises (212,457) by the type of legal status, the number of companies that constituted 86.3% of the total number of enterprises was 183,405 (down by 8.3% compared to the previous year). The number of other corporations was 1,921 (down by 6.3% id.) constituting 0.9% of the total. The number of individual proprietorship was 27,131 (down by 24.6% id.) constituting 12.8% of the total.(Table 1 and Table 2)

And in all enterprises (212,457), the number of enterprises with one establishment was 197,792 (down by 11.0% compared to the previous year), constituting almost 93.1% of the total. The number of enterprises with two or more establishments was 14,665 (down by 7.4 % id.), constituting 6.9 % of the total. (Table 2)

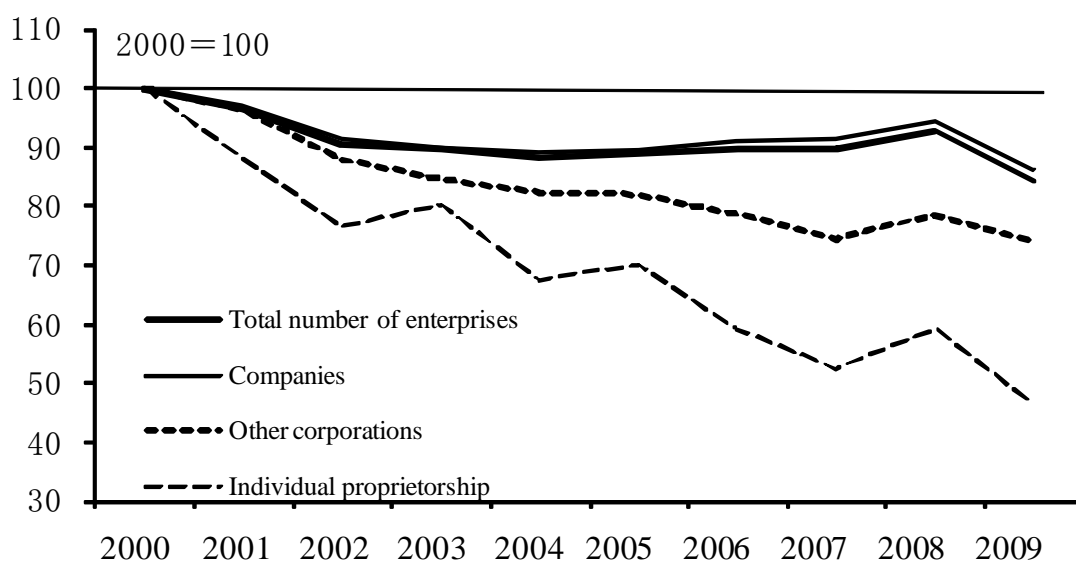

## 2. Number of employees

- (1) The number of employees was 7,735,789 (down by 7.5% compared to the previous year). According to the tabulation by the type of legal status, the company employees were 7,505,285 (down by 7.1% id.), constituting 97.0% of the total. The number of employees in the "Other corporations" category was 54,348 (down by 3.0% id.), constituting 0.7% of the total. And the individual proprietorship employees were 176,156 (down by 21.9% id.), constituting 2.3% of the total. (Table 4, Figure 4 and Figure 5)

The number of employees of the enterprises with one establishment were 4,115,686, constituting 53.2% of the total employees of the enterprises (down by 7.7% compared to the previous year). And the employees of the enterprises with two or more establishments were 3,620,103, constituting 46.8% of the total (down by 7.3% compared to the previous year). According to the tabulation by the type of legal status and the size of capital, the number of employees of the companies classified with capital less than 10 million yen that have one establishment constituted 95.4% of the total employees of this class. And the number of employees of the companies classified with capital more than 10 billion yen that have two or more establishments constituted almost 95.3% of the total employees of this class.

### 3. Value of manufactured goods shipments

- (1) The value of manufactured goods shipments (hereinafter referred to as “value of shipments”) was 265.26 trillion yen (down by 21.0% compared to the previous year). According to the tabulation by the type of legal status, the value of shipments of the companies was 263.22 trillion yen (down by 21.0% id.), constituting 99.2% of the total. The value of shipments of the other corporations was 1.18 trillion yen (down by 1.4% id.), constituting 0.4% of the total. And that of the individual proprietorship was 858.8 billion yen (down by 27.8% id.), constituting 0.3% of the total. (Table 6 and Table 7)

The value of shipments of enterprises with one establishment was 89.71 trillion yen, constituting 33.8% of the total value of the enterprises, and the value of shipments of enterprises with two or more establishments was 175.55 trillion yen, constituting 66.2% of the total. (Table 7)

Although the enterprises with one establishment constituted almost 93.1% of the total number of enterprises and 53.2% of the total employees of the enterprises, the value of shipments of them constituted only one-third (33.8%) of the total.

##### (1) Number of enterprises by industrial middle classification

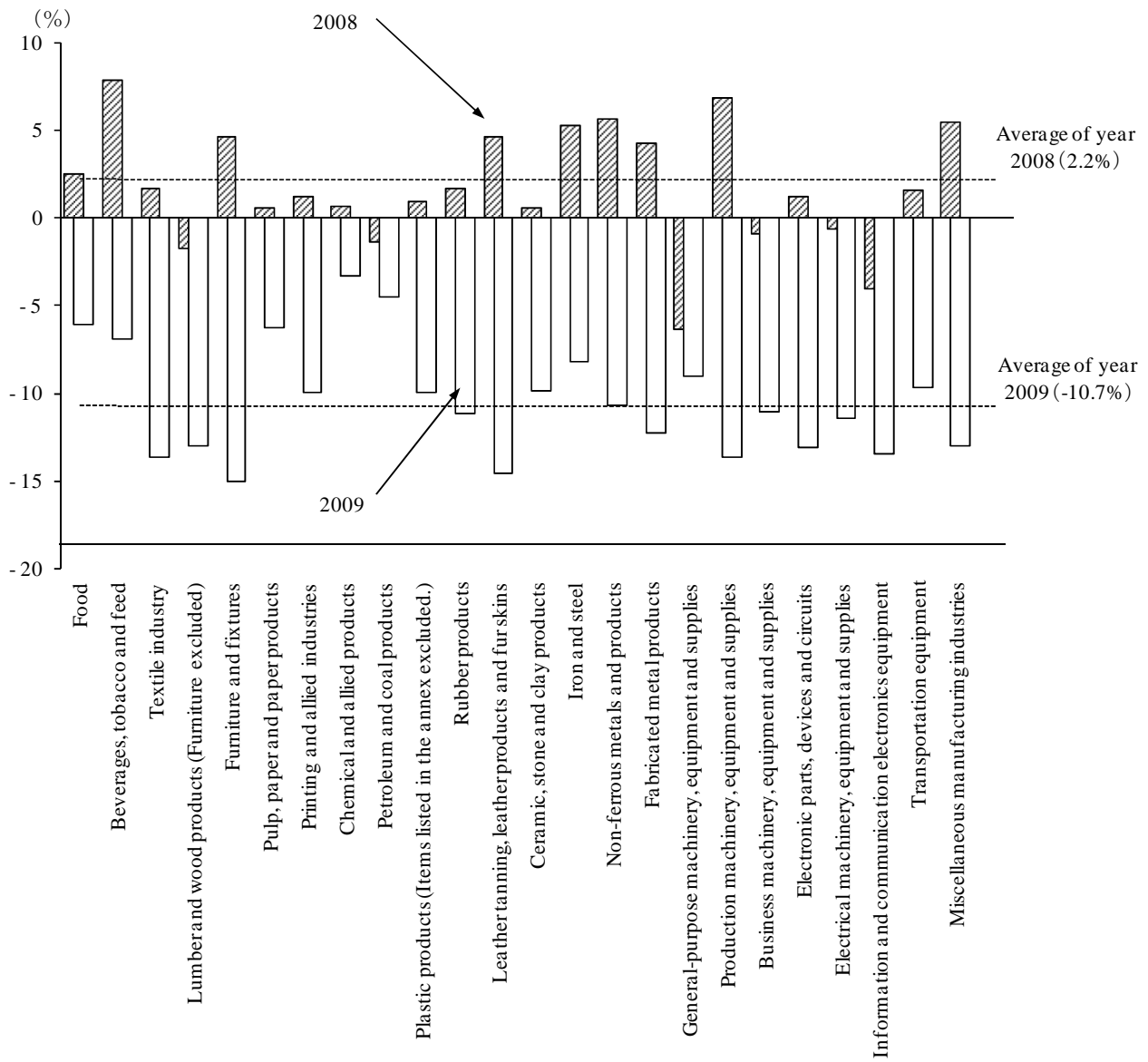
###### (a) Number of enterprises

The number of enterprises was 212,457 (down by 10.7% compared to the previous year). According to the tabulation by industrial middle classification, the number of the enterprises decreased in all the 24 industries that include (in order of contribution) “Manufacture of fabricated metal products” (down by 12.3% compared id.), “Manufacture of production machinery, equipment and supplies” (down by 13.6% id.), “Textile industry” (down by 13.7% id.), “Manufacture of food” (down by 6.1% id.) and “Printing and allied industries” (down by 10.0% id.). (b) Number of large enterprises by industrial middle classification (Note)

The number of large enterprises was 1,879 (down by 5.3% compared to the previous year). According to the tabulation by industrial middle classification, the number of the large enterprises decreased in 16 industries that include (in order of contribution) “Manufacture of electronic parts and devices and electronic circuits” (down by 12.6% id.), “Manufacture of production machinery, equipment and supplies” (down by 11.5% id.), “Manufacture of plastic products, except otherwise classified” (down by 12.4% id.) and “Manufacture of electrical machinery, equipment and supplies” (down by 7.6% id.), increased in 4 industries that include “Textile industry” (up by 7.4% id.), “Printing and allied industries”(up by 2.9% id.), “Manufacture of iron and steel” (up by 1.3% id.) and “Manufacture of business machinery, equipment and supplies” (up by 1.7% id.), and remained unchanged in 4 industries that include “Manufacture of petroleum and coal products”, “Manufacture of rubber products”, “Manufacture of leather tanning, leather products and fur skins” and “Manufacture of ceramic, stone and clay products”. (c) Number of small and medium-sized enterprises by industrial middle classification

The number of small and medium-sized enterprises was 210,578 (down by 10.8% compared to the previous year). According to the tabulation by industrial middle classification, the number of small and medium-sized enterprises decreased in all the 24 industries that include (in order of contribution) “Manufacture of fabricated metal products” (down by 12.3% compared to the previous year), “Manufacture of production machinery, equipment and supplies” (down by 13.7% id.), “Textile industry” (down by 13.7% id.), “Manufacture of food” (down by 6.1% id.) and “Printing and allied industries” (down by 10.0% id.). 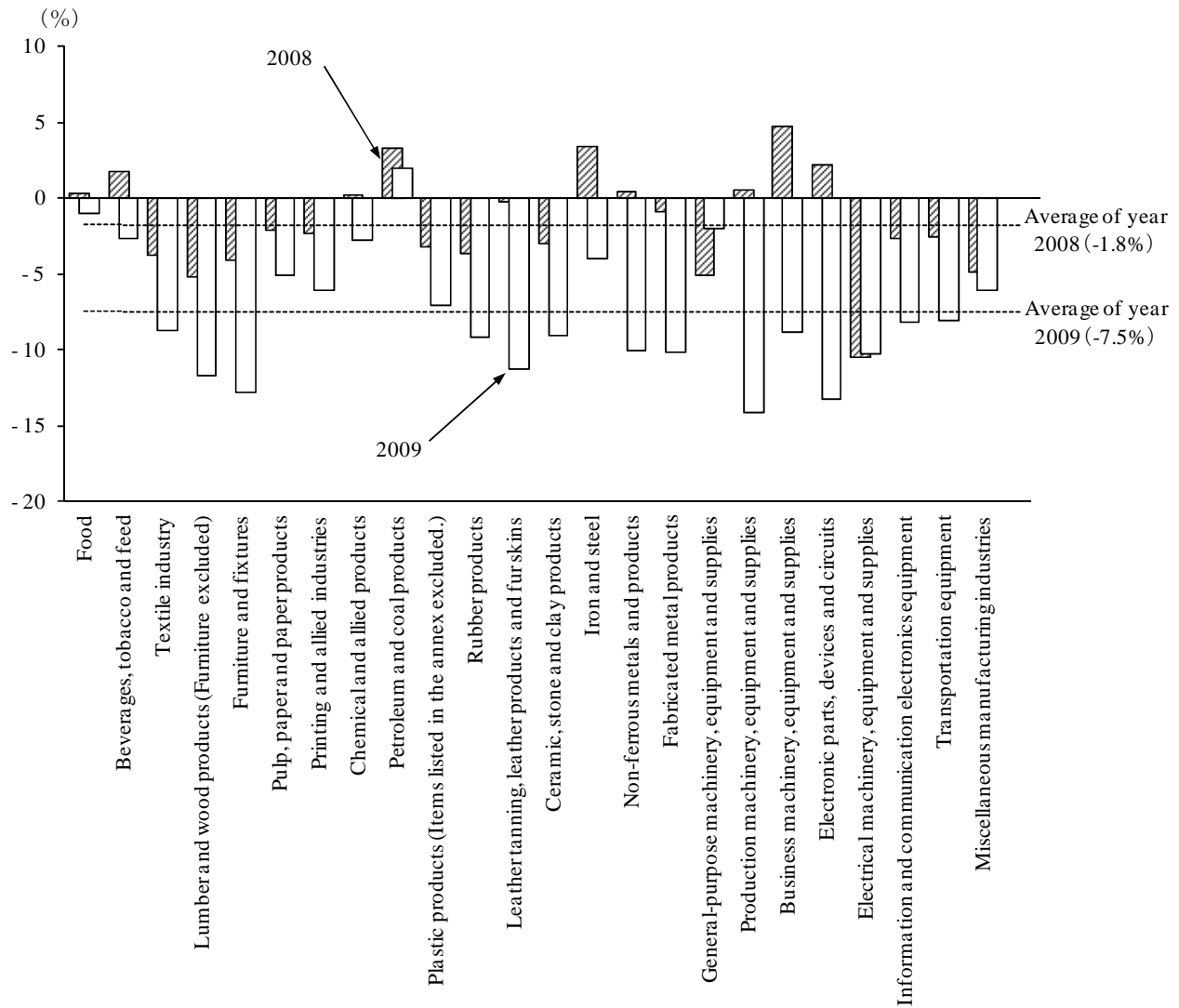

According to the tabulation by industrial middle classification, the number of the employees decreased in 23 industries that include “Manufacture of transportation equipment” (down by 8.1% id.), “Manufacture of production machinery, equipment and supplies” (down by 14.1% id.), “Manufacture of electronic parts and devices and electronic circuits” (down by 13.3% id.), “Manufacture of fabricated metal products” (down by 10.2% id.) and “Manufacture of electrical machinery, equipment and supplies” (down by 10.3% id.), and increased in “Manufacture of petroleum and coal products”(up by 2.0% id.). The number of employees in large enterprises was 2,486,398 (down by 6.9% compared to the previous year). According to the tabulation by the industrial middle classification, the number of employees decreased in 18 industries that include (in order of contribution) “Manufacture of transportation equipment” (down by 7.5% id.), “Manufacture of electronic parts and devices and electronic circuits” (down by 14.7% id.), “Manufacture of production machinery, equipment and supplies” (down by 18.4% id.), “Manufacture of electrical machinery, equipment and supplies” (down by 11.5% id.) and “Manufacture of information and communication electronics equipment” (down by 8.1% id.), and increased in 6 industries that include “Manufacture of general-purpose machinery, equipment and supplies” (up by 6.9% id.), “Textile industry” (up by 17.2% id.), “Manufacture of iron and steel” (up by 0.9% id.), “Manufacture of food” (up by 0.4% id.) and “Manufacture of petroleum and coal products”(up by 3.2% id.). 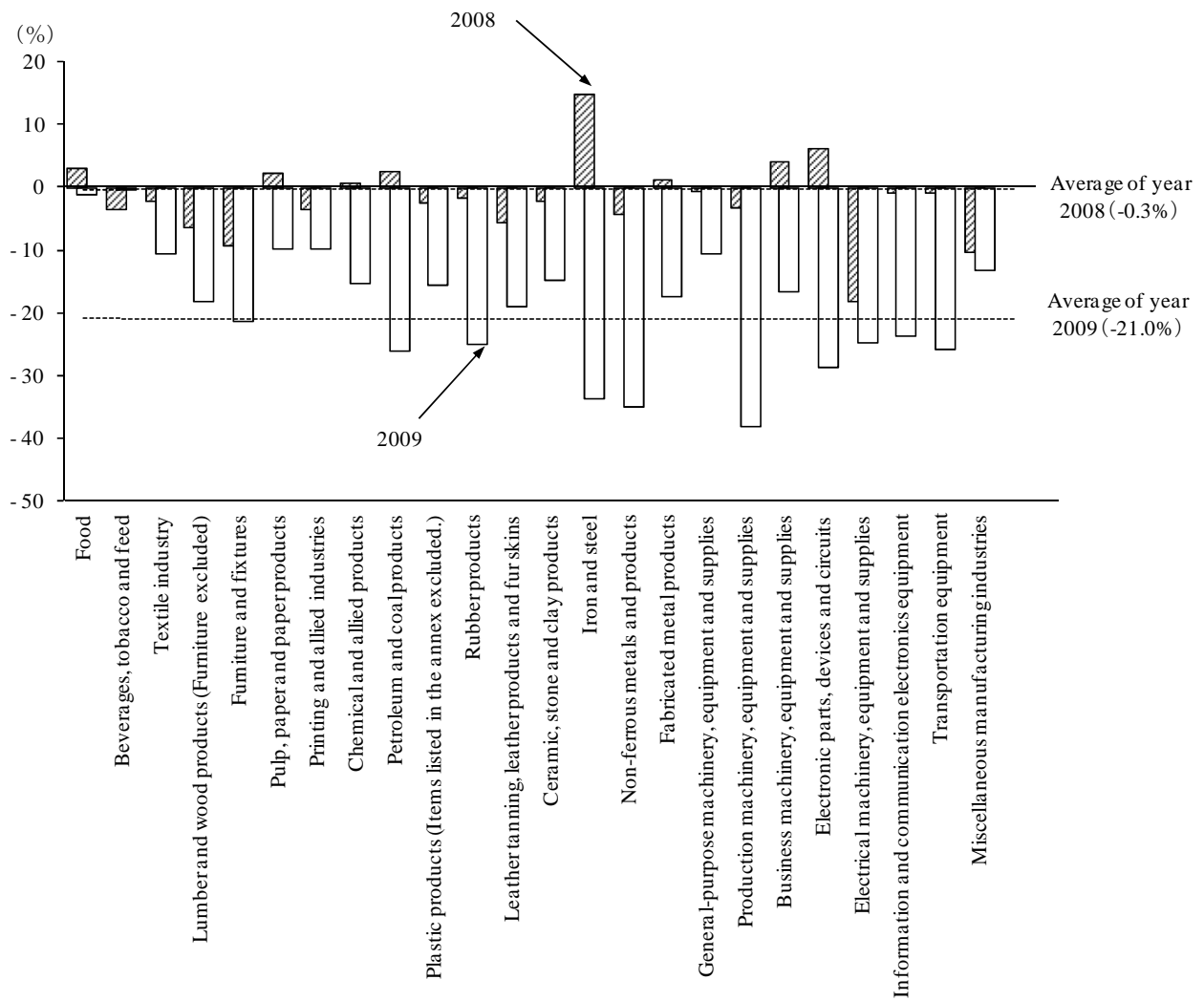

According to the tabulation by the industrial middle classification, the value of manufactured goods shipments decreased in 21 industries that include (in order of contribution) “Manufacture of transportation equipment” (down by 26.4% id.), “Manufacture of iron and steel” (down by 34.2% id.), “Manufacture of electronic parts and devices and electronic circuits” (down by 29.6% id.), “Manufacture of production machinery, equipment and supplies” (down by 45.4% id.), and “Manufacture of petroleum and coal products” (down by 25.6% id.) , and increased in “Textile industry” (up by 27.6% id.). According to the tabulation by industrial middle classification, the value of manufactured goods shipments decreased in 21 industries that include “Manufacture of production machinery, equipment and supplies” (down by 32.5% id.), “Manufacture of iron and steel” (down by 31.8% id.), “Manufacture of transportation equipment” (down by 22.3% id.), “Manufacture of fabricated metal products” (down by 17.9% id.) and “Manufacture of non-ferrous metals and products” (down by 38.2% id.), and increased in “Manufacture of beverages, tobacco and feed” (up by 2.4% id.).
