Conceptual Roadmap on Building an Export-Oriented Industrial Corridor



- In consultation with the Government of Sri Lanka, the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry took the initiative in formulating the Conceptual Roadmap for promoting investment in Sri Lanka
- The Conceptual Roadmap envisions leveraging South Asia's massive market to promote regional trade and integrate Sri Lanka into global supply chains.
- To that end, the Conceptual Roadmap proposes the establishment of an economic corridor in Sri Lanka and neighboring South Asian countries.

Sri Lanka's Investment Potential and Comparative Advantages

- Geographical Advantage: Located at the junction of key sea lanes. The country also offers good access to the massive markets of South Asia.
- Abundant natural resources: Possesses the potential to supply key resources (silica, graphite, rubber, etc.).
 - ⇒ Exporting components produced in Sri Lanka to neighboring countries for final assembly, diversifying supply chains.
- In addition, Sri Lanka offers a favorable investment climate: The country is showing sings of economic recovery toward stability, has a low-cost, high-quality workforce, and is pro-Japanese in sentiment.

Challenges in Promoting Investment and How to Address Them

- Building an integrated economic zone including Japan to capture the South Asian market and integrate South Asian countries into the global supply chain
 - > Propose establishing a trilateral working group with neighboring countries, in addition to Sri Lanka and Japan
 - > Propose <u>a business forum</u> organized by the <u>Chambers of Commerce</u> of the neighboring countries, in addition to those of Sri Lanka and Japan.
- Improving Sri Lanka's business environment (such aspects as infrastructure development, regulatory and institutional barriers, and policies to attract investment)
 - > Japan and Sri Lanka agreed to <u>resume the Inter-governmental Economic Policy Dialogue</u> (There has been no meeting since the first meeting which took place in July 2016.)
