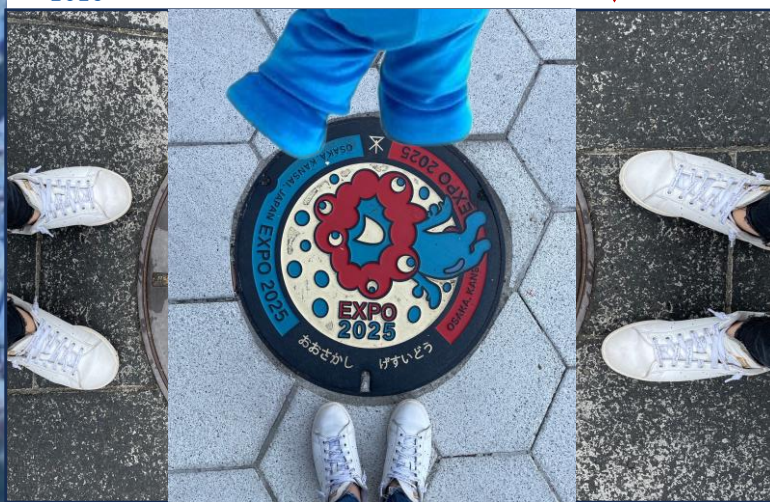

Nestled in the heart of Japan's mountainous Gifu prefecture, Hida Takayama offers travelers a glimpse of the country's rich culture through its beautifully preserved historic streets with traditional wooden merchant houses. It is said to have inspired the settings for various anime series, where visitors can explore the locations featured in these shows.

Approximately 50 minutes by bus from Takayama lies Shirakawa-go, a UNESCO World Heritage site celebrated for its unique gassho-zukuri farmhouses. These architectural marvels, characterized by their steeply pitched thatched roofs

In the northern districts of Kyoto is the stunning sight of the Amanohashidate sandbar. Seen from the Hiryu-kan on the hills above, it resembles a dragon soaring into the sky.

The open chairlift ride offers lovely city views on the way up, leading to even more picturesque sights and activities at the viewpoint. Perfect for families and friends, it features games for all ages and a unique elevated bicycle experience.

Around a 30-min drive from Amanohashidate is Ine Town, a fishing village nestled between the mountains and Ine Bay. Visitors can enjoy an exciting boat ride and experience the thrill of feeding seagulls up close.

Naiku of Ise Jingu is considered Japan's most sacred shrine, enshrining Amaterasu Omikami, the goddess of the sun.

A short walk from the shrine leads to the charming streets of Oharaimachi and Okage Yokochi, where you can savor local specialties like Matsuzaka beef sushi and explore shops offering pearl jewelry and cosmetics.

About a 30-minute drive away is Ama Hut Hachiman, where you can enjoy a bountiful seafood harvest gathered and prepared by the women divers, called "ama".

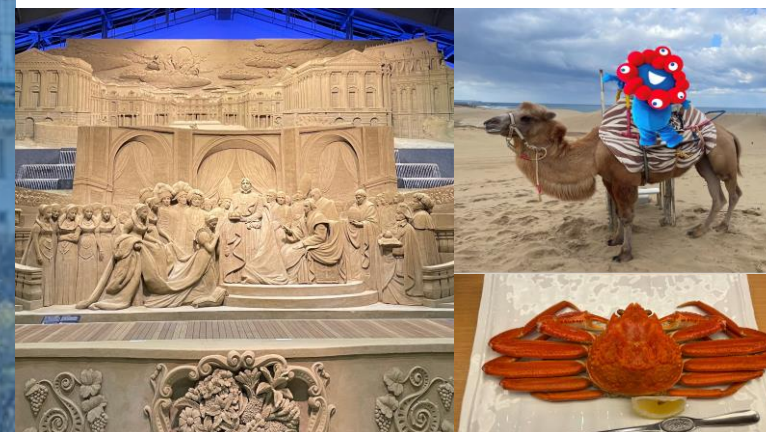
