

#### **Preface**

- (1) "Japan Industrial Townships (JITs)" were agreed to be developed as one of the initiatives in "the Japan-India Investment Promotion Partnership" announced by Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and Prime Minister Narendra Modi in September 2014.
- (2) In April 2015, Minister of METI Yoichi Miyazawa and Minister of MoCI Nirmala Sitharaman signed "India-Japan Investment and Trade Promotion and Asia-Pacific Economic Integration" and agreed to take steps to develop 11 potential sites as JITs in India. Later, Pithanpur Industrial Area, Madhya Pradesh was also designated as a JIT (Total number of JITs is 12).
  - →JITs are designed as integrated industrial parks so that Japanese companies can smoothly establish production sites and operate their business, thereby facilitating their investment in India and contributing to policies of India such as "Make in India/Make for World".
- (3) In March 2022, Prime Minister Fumio Kishida and Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed their intention to realize JPY 5 trillion of public and private investment and financing from Japan to India in the next five years following the successfully achieved investment target of JPY 3.5 trillion announced in 2014.
  - → In this context, India-Japan Industrial Competitiveness Partnership (IJICP) Roadmap was formulated between METI and DPIIT, including setting up of JITs Working Group (WG).

- (4) 1<sup>st</sup> JITs WG was held between METI and DPIIT on 20<sup>th</sup> February 2023, in order to monitor the progress and serve to enhance communication between relevant stakeholders of Japan and India for addressing issues faced by Japanese companies.
  - →Promotion and effective utilization of JITs are further important to implement the above target of JPY 5 trillion financing and investment and to materialize the initiative under IJICP.
- (5) This report summarizes the efforts and achievements by Japan for 11 JITs in 8 states in India. ("□" in the following pages represents efforts and achievements which had taken place since 2023, while "●" represents those before then)
- (6) India has also prepared its own progress report with regard to its efforts to improve business environment of JITs.

### **Overall Progress of JITs**

#### **Status of JITs investment by Japanese Companies**

- □ 116 Japanese companies are active in 8 JITs\*. \*Japanese recognition including Operation and Construction
- Net increase of 6 companies compared to that in February 2023.
- □ The year 2023 was the year that India strongly drew the attention of the world as becoming the most populous in the world, hosting G20 as the chair country, successfully landing "Chandrayaan-3," the world's first unmanned lunar probe and so on. Along with this, interest of Japanese companies is tending to increase to invest in India thereby JITs.
- Acceleration of physical interaction such as mission visits and events in the post-pandemic economy.

- ◆ 37 JIMs and 11 JECs have been launched in total as of January 2024.



→JCCII raised 81 issues (new 40, Continued 41) including JITs-related issues for enhancement of business environment in India, followed by the clarification or instruction for further follow-up by Indian side.

  - (2) Japanese Endowed Courses (JEC)





#### Promotion by JETRO (Business Support Centre)

- JETRO opened Ahmedabad Office in November 2017 to accelerate the Japanese investments to Gujarat and JIT. This office is 5<sup>th</sup> JETRO office in India.
- JETRO established BSC in July 2018 at its Ahmedabad Office to support Japanese investors (short-term rental office/specialized advices) inaugurated by Hon'ble CM Shri Vijay Rupani.
- JETRO Team supports existing companies in JITs and potential investors.

#### **Concept of Business Support Center (BSC)**

- Designed as a total support center for Japanese companies planning to invest into India.
- Leases short-term office and offers consulting services to Japanese companies.
- > Helps Japanese companies gather information efficiently, conduct Feasibility Studies for a long term business plan for Gujarat unit, and solve problems in establishing a local unit.

- □ JETRO supported the VG Roadshow of CM Mr. Patel to Japan and arranged 1to1 meetings with 18 leading Japanese companies in Japan and dispatched a mission with over 200 members of Japanese companies facilitated by JETRO for VG2024.
- 25 MoUs between Japanese companies and the GoGJ was signed in 2017 and 2018 with the amount of 38.4 billion rupees investment and 6,290 jobs creation in Gujarat.

- □ Vice-Minister for International Affairs of METI participated in Vibrant Gujarat and delivered the speech that referred to the support for JITs in order to contribute to "Make in India" policy.
- □ Vice-Minister for International Affairs of METI met with the CM of Gujarat, Bhupendra Patel, with 3 Japanese companies, referring to continuous promotion of JITs and requesting further improvement of business environment in JITs.
- Deputy Director-General of METI and Chief Secretary of GoGJ held 5th Policy Dialogue in July 2019. GoGJ committed to complete widening of State Highway 7 by June 2020, establish the second entrance at Mandal, consideration for establishment of a fire station and further improvement of security in Mandal, qualify Plug & Play Industrial Park (or its tenant manufacturing companies) for Gujarat State's incentive schemes.




#### Challenges to improve the business environment of JITs

- ☐ Frequent power outage
- > Japanese companies operating in Mandal Japanese industrial park reported frequent power outages in the industrial park. JETRO offered to resolve the issue with GIDC.
- Requested to appear in court, despite GIDC issue
- Four Japanese companies operating in the industrial park received requests to appear in court. It was that the descendants of the landowner demanded the return of their land. Since GIDC, not the company, has ownership of the land, so GIDC is taking the lead in dealing with the issue.
- Improvement of environment of Japanese residents
- A Japanese village is being formed in the Mandal-Becharaji region as the eco-system, led by Suzuki, Honda, and their supplier companies, continues to grow. Once the introduction of the EV line by Suzuki and the construction of its 5th plant are realized soon, the ecosystem will become even more sophisticated and the number of Japanese residents in this area is expected to increase. In order to improve the quality of life of Japanese residents in this area, we would like to see the opening of a liquor store in a hotel in the area approved as soon as possible.







#### <Neemrana Industrial Park>

- ☐ Improve stable power supply shall be crucial under GRAP regulations, which literally prohibits the use of DG sets.
  - > Well advance notice for planned shutdown for maintenance
  - Improve maintenance to reduce unscheduled power failure
  - > Enhance communication with Japanese companies
- ☐ Improve industrial water supply shall be crucial to attract Japanese companies.
  - > Short supply of water has affected operations of some Japanese companies
- Improve gas infrastructure shall be crucial to comply with CAQM GRAP regulations.
  - Insufficient gas infrastructure deployment hinders the usage of gas generators during power failure




### 4. Andhra Pradesh

#### Major requests from Japanese companies in Sri City at Andhra Pradesh

- Refund of incentives (VAT/GST refund) are pending
- ➤ Some Japanese companies are yet to receive the refund of VAT, GST and the incentives committed by the Government of Andra Pradesh. This is affecting their cashflow and making the smooth operations difficult. Hence kindly assure the refund, at least, partial amount in this regard to be paid before March 2024 so that is could alleviate some of their financial burdens.
- Reconsideration on current annual increase of 5% in IALA Property Tax
- Japanese companies would like to request the government to waive the annual 5% increment of property tax for companies in Sri City. Currently this incentive is applicable only to those companies situated in urban areas.
- Improvement of electricity supply environment.
- ➤ Japanese companies would like to seek support in exempting Sri City from "power holiday" and also in rectifying power dips experienced 9 to 10 times a month. Power outages, short or long, disrupt business operations affecting their productivity.

# Cross-cutting Issues

## JPY 5 trillion Intention and IJICP Framework

### JPY 5 trillion Intention for Investment/Financing

- Prime Minister Fumio Kishida and Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed their satisfaction in March 2022 at the occasion of annual summit in Delhi that the investment target of JPY 3.5 trillion announced by Prime Minister Abe and Modi in 2014 has been achieved.
- Subsequently, they expressed their shared intention to realize JPY 5 trillion of public and private investment
  and financing from Japan to India in the next five years.
- In this context, various initiatives have been taken by both Japan and India to strengthen their economic cooperation including IJICP.

### India-Japan Industrial Competitiveness Partnership (IJICP)

- METI Minister Hiroshi Kajiyama and MoCI Minister Piyush Goyal launched the India-Japan IJICP in December 2019 to jointly explore the possibilities of enhancing India's industrial competitiveness through cooperation between Japan and India.
- The MoC was signed between Vice Minister for International Affairs, METI and Secretary, DPIIT in November 2021 to formalize the IJICP Mechanism.
- The roadmap under the IJICP was formulated between Vice Minister for International Affairs, METI and Secretary, DPIIT in March 2022 at the occasion of the Japan-India summit to further promote industrial cooperation between the two countries including in the areas of manufacturing and supply chains, which have also mentioned the possible formulation of sector-wise WGs including JITs.

- India has been rapidly transforming in the field of <u>manufacturing including the high-tech sector</u>, <u>digital economy</u>, and <u>clean energy with new technologies</u> under the "Self-reliant India Policy".



- The project has focused on constructing track of the Western DFC between Delhi and Mumbai, connecting major cities in the states of Maharashtra, Gujarat, Rajasthan and Haryana, as well as introducing electric locomotives capable of high-speed, high-capacity transportation.
- This is the first Japanese ODA Loan which "Special Terms for Economic Partnership (STEP)" is applied to in India.
- The project is an important part of "Delhi-Mumbai Industrial Corridor (DMIC) initiative".


