


Regulatory reform system for business units based on the Industrial Competitiveness Enhancement Act

Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI)

Promotion of Regulatory Reform through "Three-Tier" Initiatives

- Regulatory reform is an important policy issue for achieving sustainable economic growth led by private-sector demand.
- In addition to "national level" reform through discussions at the Council for Promotion of Regulatory Reform, etc., and "regional level" reform through special zone systems, such as the National Strategic Special Zones, etc., we will promote regulatory reform by utilizing a three-tiered structure for "company level" reform that includes "Regulatory Sandbox Scheme," "System of Special Arrangements for Corporate Field Tests," and "System to Remove Gray Zone Areas".



Overview of the System to Remove Gray Zone Areas

• This is a system that allows entrepreneurs who intend to engage in new business activities to check in advance, in accordance with their specific business plans, whether the regulations are applicable or not so that they can conduct new business activities at ease, even in fields where the scope of application of current regulations is unclear.

Application Flow

The competent ministers (minister with jurisdiction over business and minister with jurisdiction over regulations) shall provide necessary information and advice in response to consultation with entrepreneurs amidst the confirmation of the content of new business activities.



Inquiry regarding the applicability of the regulation



1) Request for confirmation

Minister with jurisdiction over business Minister with jurisdiction over regulations



2) Jointly signed by both ministers

Response regarding the applicability of the regulation

- 1) An entrepreneur who intends to engage in a new business activity shall request confirmation from the competent minister to check whether the regulations are applicable to the new business activity or not.
- 2) Upon receiving a request for confirmation, the competent minister determines whether or not the regulations are applicable in line with the specific business plan of the entrepreneur, and replies to the entrepreneur (generally, the minister replies within one month; if it's not possible then he has to notify the applicant of the reason within one month).

After responding to the inquirer, the competent minister publishes a summary of the response.

*The inquiry form is published based on the consent of the inquirer.

Example Case

Comprehensive consulting service for sleeping environments

[Applicant] Nishikawa Corporation (Chuo, Tokyo)

[Project description]

For users who want to improve their sleep, we analyze and visualize their sleeping environment through interviews and simple measurements, and provide comprehensive consulting services related to the sleeping environment, including advice on improving the sleeping environment and recommended products based on the results of such analysis.

[Inquiry details]

Does this service fall under the category of "medical practice" permitted only for physicians under Article 17 of the Medical Practitioners Act?



[Results]

More than 30 stores with a dedicated "Sleeping Counseling Center" have been opened nationwide to offer the services launched through the system.

Overview of System of Special Arrangements for Corporate Field Tests

• This is a system that allows entrepreneurs who intend to engage in new business activities to propose special measures for regulations that would hinder such activities and allow the application on a "company level", in line with a specific business plan, provided that safety, etc., is ensured.



Example Case

Riding high assist force electric-assist bicycles with trailers on public roads

[Applicant] Yamaha Motor Co. (Iwata, Shizuoka) Yamato Transport Co.(Chuo, Tokyo)

【特例内容】

It is now possible to use electric-assist bicycles with the upper limit of assist force being three times the stepping force. (At that time, the Road Traffic Act's enforcement regulations had limited the assist force to two times)



*Implement alternative measures such as road safety education for drivers involved and the establishment of a system to properly perform tasks required for safe driving, and conduct demonstrations.

[Results]

Since the demonstration tests were conducted in Tokyo, Hokkaido, Kanagawa, Kyoto, Osaka, and Fukuoka, and satisfactory results were obtained on safety and other aspects while riding under various conditions, the regulations were relaxed (the Road Traffic Act's enforcement regulations were amended) and it is possible to use electric bicycles with the upper limit of assist force being three times the stepping force.

Overview of the Regulatory Sandbox Scheme

• This is a system that allows for rapid demonstration of innovative technologies and business models such as Al, IoT, and blockchain by restricting the period of time and participants, etc. without being subject to regulations, and using the information and data obtained from the demonstration for the review purpose.



^{*}If new special measures for regulations are to be developed, a request is made to the competent minister prior to applying for planning (the process is the same as for plan approval)

Role of the Ministry with Jurisdiction over Business

When applying for the System to Remove Gray Zone Areas, etc., the ministry or agency responsible for the project supports proactively at each stage of the application process from the perspective of the entrepreneur who is considering applying for the system.




