End of Life Vehicle (ELV) Recycling Law





People and companies involved in handling ELVs within Japan are obliged to complete the duties and procedures (acquiring authorization from local autonomous bodies, etc.) required by the ELV Recycling Law.


The ELV Recycling Law was enacted in January 2005.

Failure to complete the required procedures will subject the person(s) to penal punishment.



Point 1

People and companies involved in handling ELVs must register and receive authorization from the city or prefectural government. Use the following check-list to confirm you are operating within the law:



Point 2

People and companies involved in handling ELVs must be registered in the ELV Recycling System in addition to being registered and authorized by the city or prefectural government.

Point 3

People or companies involved in handling ELVs or scrapped vehicles without authorization are subject to penal punishment (five years or less in prison or a fine of ¥10 million or less) as unregistered and unauthorized ELV handling agents. Take note that several ELV handling agents have already been arrested and subject to severe punishment by the authorities in Japan for being in violation of the ELV Recycling Law.

• ELV handling agents who take back or hand over ELVs must report by computer through the Internet. [Electronic Manifest System]



Note that the people or companies involved in handling ELVs or scrapped vehicles without the above-mentioned registrations or authorizations are subject to penal punishment (five years or less in prison or a fine of ¥10 million or less) as unregistered and unauthorized ELV handling agents.

Organization of the ELV Recycling Law

- 1 As a basic principle the recycling fee is paid by the owner of the vehicle when it is purchased new or when subject to renewal inspections.
- 2 People or companies involved in the handling of ELVs must be registered with and authorized by the city or prefectural government.
- 3 Shredder dust, airbags (incl. seatbelt pretensioners) and fluorocarbons recovered are collected by the vehicle manufacturer or importer for recycling purposes (fluorocarbons are decomposed).



 Note that it is illegal in principle to re-register or export a vehicle that has already been designated as an ELV.
