Airbus perspective to the commercial aviation industry

- Diversification of sources enabling post-Covid recovery: A220, A320, A330 and A350 undergoing ramp-up simultaneously, driving an organic growth for the Japanese aviation industry
- Comprehensive decarbonisation policy at Airbus: latest generation aircraft, operations & infrastructures, SAF, disruptive technology (wings, engines, hybridisation, hydrogen aircraft), market-based measures
- Next generation platforms: single aisle, hydrogen aircraft

2030

- Reduce by 63% Scope 1 & 2 industrial emissions
 Target validated by the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi)
- Offer 100% SAF capability on our commercial aircraft

2035

- Reduce by 46% the CO₂ emissions intensity generated by our commercial aircraft (Scope 3 Use of Sold Products)
 Target validated by the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi)
- Be the 1st major manufacturer to offer a hydrogen-powered aircraft



A huge opportunity lies in front of the Japanese aviation ecosystem

- METI-Airbus partnership MoU in 2017: Cooperation between Airbus and the local aviation ecosystem developed strongly over the last few years thanks to the METI industry and R&T strategy
- Opportunities for Japan: diversification of sources and collaboration with multiple OEM's
- Shared decarbonisation ambition creating a room for genuine partnership with multiple OEM's
- Collaboration is our DNA: Airbus formed as a consortium of 4 european companies, overseas FAL's (US and China), BK117/H145 co-development
- Be open to collaborate with several OEM's and large T1's in various domains
- SME's would benefit from Airbus relationship with the larger local suppliers or directly when innovative and competitive solutions are proposed
